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with a focus on how design will change our future, this edition of design indaba maps key social movements set to define the next decade as a species through the works and ideas of its 2020 speakers. key topics that will be addressed at the conference this year include: redesigning cities of the future; solving challenges with biotech; the rise of dissent and activism; the evolution of data visualisation; biophilic design for better health; the challenge of interstellar migration, rethinking identity; representing the global diaspora; identifying alternative resources; the rise of radical empathy; and unmanned aerial vehicles are rewriting art's future.

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

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

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
